# Preschools to 6th graders prepare for the November PBS Reading Marathon!

Your preschooler to 6th grader can earn a free Adventure Pass to various museums after completing the PBS Reading Marathon in November. How does it work? 1. Download the Reading Log (English link, Spanish link) 2. Read 20 minutes each day for the month of November 3. Submit your log between November 30th



to December 15th 4. Get your free pass. Here are the participating museums: Clark Planetarium Discovery Gateway, Intermountain Therapy Animals, Natural History Museum of Utah, Ogden Nature Center, Red Butte Garden, Salt Lake City Public Library, Thanksgiving Point, Tracy Aviary, USU Prehistoric Museum in Price, Bean Life Science Museum, and Hogle Zoo. #### **National Report Card and Utah**



Parents, the national report card – the national scores of our students - are out. Nation's Report Card

These nationwide tests are performed on 4th and 8th graders every second year.

What are we learning? Utah <u>fourth graders in reading</u> dropped from fourth best

state in 2019 to seventh place in the nation. Eighth graders in reading rose from sixth to third best state in the nation. Utah fourth graders in math rose from ninth best in 2019 to fifth. Utah eighth graders in math rose from 16th to second best in the nation. Utah was one of 18 states that did not see a statistical decline in eighth grade reading and did not show a statistically significant decline in eighth grade mathematics scores. View the National Report Card. Although there are many positive results for our Utah students in this report, much progress can still be made in our schools.
