What is Reflections?

National PTA Reflections welcomes, free of charge, students from all grades and abilities to explore and be involved in the arts. Annually, thousands of students will reflect on a common theme and create original works of art in the categories of Dance Choreography, Film Production, Literature, Music Composition, Photography, 2D Visual Arts, and 3D Visual Arts. Entries are scored by volunteer judges with 40% of points awarded for Interpretation of Theme, 30% awarded for creativity, and 30% for mastery of skill.

PTA volunteers run the Reflections program at local (school), council, region, and state levels. Utah receives roughly 15,000 entries each year. Around 300,000 entries are submitted nationwide.

Levels of Reflections

LOCAL

The Reflections program starts at the school level. Students compete against other students from their school.

Each school advances their top winners, called Awards of Excellence, to the next level, either council or region.

COUNCIL

2nd level for most regions. Many schools compete against each other at the council level. Award of Excellence winners are advanced to the region level.

You can run Reflections on more than one level. Regions are often in need of help at the council level.

Levels of Reflections

REGION

Depending on your area, your region might have the same boundaries as your school district, or it might comprise multiple school districts. Regions are identified by numbers. Ex: Those living in Granite School District are in region 5. Each region has a director that represents them on the state PTA board.

STATE

Utah is divided into 21 regions. In 2023-2024, 17 regions participated in Reflections, with 16,212 entries statewide. The state advances 30 entries to the national level of competition, one per category/division. Around 170 entries are awarded at the state level.

- Accessible Arts Division is an option for students with disabilities who may receive services under IDEA or ADA

Become a Specialist in URO

Reflections is managed online via Utah Reflections Online. To manage your school, you will need to designate at least one person to be your school's specialist.

■ Specialist access should be set up by the level above you, but can also be set by the previous specialist(s) for your school. If you are having trouble finding out who your specialist is for the next level, email <u>reflections@utahpta.org</u> and include your school name.

Become a Specialist in URO

■ When you are set as a specialist, if you do not already have a Utah PTA account, you will receive an email instructing you to create a password. You will then have access to log into Utah Reflections Online at <u>www.utahpta.org/ref</u>. If you already have an account, you will not receive an email.

■ Why would you already have an account? If you have registered for convention, other events through Whova, an online training, or other Utah PTA programs or if you have judged Reflections, you likely already have a Utah PTA account. Since you are here, you should have an account already.

Become a Specialist in URO

Once you log into the system, click on the red "Go to Reflections Admin" button. This is where you manage your unit, entries, and judging. Before you launch your program, delete any specialists who are no longer involved in Reflections. To do this, click on the "Specialists" tab. You will see a list of people who are specialists for your school. To remove someone, click on the red "Remove" button to the right of their name.

Eligibility and Registration

■ Who is eligible to participate in Reflections? PTAs must be in good standing with the Utah PTA to offer Reflections. You can see this online now.

Reflections is a program offered to students who are enrolled in a PTA school in good standing, as determined by Utah PTA. If you are unsure whether your PTA is in good standing, talk with your PTA President or Region Director.

Eligibility and Registration

The following additional guideline applies to students' entries:

For secondary schools (middle, junior, and high schools), the students must be enrolled in a class that offers credit in order to qualify to participate in Reflections.
 For elementary schools, the students must be enrolled for one class offered during school hours to qualify to participate.

■ For students who are enrolled in an online school, that school must have a PTA in good standing to manage the program.

■ Students may only enter through the school in which they are enrolled.

Eligibility and Registration

To Register with National PTA

Go to <u>www.pta.org/reflections</u> before November 1, 2024.

Click on "Register with National PTA"

You will need to enter your school name, address, 8-digit PTA ID number and bylaws expiration date (ask your PTA president), contact person, email, and phone number.

For the contact person and phone number, use the Reflections Specialist's information and not the school's. You will see a confirmation screen, but will not receive a confirmation email.

Registering with National PTA will not make you a Specialist for your school in Utah Reflections Online. They are two separate processes.

National PTA Reflections welcomes, free of charge, students from all grades and abilities to explore and be involved in the arts. Annually, thousands of students will reflect on a common theme and create original works of art in the categories of Dance Choreography, Film Production, Literature, Music Composition, Photography, 2D Visual Arts, and 3D Visual Arts.

"Collect" Entries

Entries will be submitted and judged on Utah Reflections Online.

Physical entries can be collected at the local level for display purposes, if desired.

Entries in the Categories of 2D Visual Arts and Photography which advance to the next level MAY be advanced physically.

■ Communicate with the level above you for details on where/when to turn in the advanced entries in the categories of 2D Visual Arts and Photography.

Qualify Entries

■ Was entry uploaded through parent account? If parent and student have same name, check to make sure that is accurate.

■ Was entry uploaded through student account? Check for Permission form. A Permission form is needed if a student uploaded their entry through a student account instead of their parent or guardian's account.

• Ensure the details section is filled out, if applicable.

■ Entries in the categories of Film Production, Dance Choreography, and Music Composition must not exceed 5 minutes.

■ Using the rules, check that each entry follows the official rules and the rules for the category.

- Check for plagiarism and copyright violations.
- Build in time for students to fix "fixable" entries before judging begins.
- If there is concerning content in the entry, reach out to a school Admin.

Judges/Judging

Judges should not know the students. Students may appear in their own entries and we want to avoid any kind of bias. National PTA strongly discourages students disclosing their identities.

■ Judges do not disqualify entries, but you may ask them to notify you if they notice an issue that might require disqualification.

Rules and rubrics are built into the judging system for the judges to see.

- Judges can live anywhere in the world.
- High school students may judge, but need adult supervision.

Communicating with Judges

Even though everything is online, you need to communicate with your judges.
The website doesn't do that for you.

- Email, text, or call them to tell them entries are ready for judging. You can also use built in templates to help you communicate.
- Clearly communicate the judging deadline, which you'll set in the system.
- Monitor to make sure judging is happening, and remind judges one week before and a few days before the deadline.
- Require a reply to communications so you know they were received.

Rank your entries by division, category, and points as scored by your judges. Assign awards based on rankings.

Award and advance one Awards of Excellence per category/division (if applicable).

Make sure that every PARTICIPATING division is represented in the entries you forward on to the next level of judging. In each category, award/advance the top scoring entry in each division. You may award/advance up to 3 additional entries per category. See chart.

Awards of Excellence must be assigned according to the chart, but numbers for Awards of Merit/Honorable Mention/Other Awards are up to you.

Award of Excellence is the top award and moves on to the next level. Only award the amount you are allowed to send on.

Award of Merit is like 2nd place. These entries do not move on.

■ Reflections does not have a minimum score required to advance. Once entries have been qualified by the committee and sent on for judging, they are eligible for awards, regardless of scores. Exceptions to this policy are only appropriate in the rare circumstance where entries fail to show a sincere effort. If you feel you have an entry you think should not advance, please make the decision as a committee, get a second opinion from the specialist at the level above you, or reach out to the state at <u>reflections@utahpta.org</u>

■ If you have a tie, break it by comparing Interpretation of Theme scores. If there is still a tie, have the entries judged by an additional judge.

■ You MUST advance the top scoring entry in each category/division, if you have an entry for that category/division. Reflections is a contest where qualified entries compete against the other qualified entries which were submitted, not against a subjective score or standard.

No substitutions are allowed due to a division receiving no entries.

Large regions that qualify to submit double entries will be notified by the state Reflections specialist on a yearly basis.

Entries may not be substituted. If you do not have an entry in a given category/division, you will send one less entry than if you did have an entry submitted in that category/division.

■ You must send the top scoring entry in each category/division. You MAY send up to three additional entries per category (Local and Council).

■ When you assign an Award of Excellence to an entry, that entry will advance to the next level. This used to be a separate step, but starting in 2024-2025, it will happen when you assign Awards of Excellence.

■ You can select multiple entries to assign awards/advance. When looking at your entries, scroll to the bottom and click, "Update multiple entries."

Download an advancement report to double check.

Download an entries spreadsheet to obtain info, including contact info.

■ If you advance an entry by mistake, you can undo the advance if the entry has not been accepted to the next level, or is set to pending at the next level.

Obtain awards and prepare entries for exhibition, whether in person or online.

Announce award recipients to the entire school community.

■ Host a Reflections celebration event to showcase student work and distribute certificates/awards.

Do not violate copyright. Film must not focus on copyrighted material.

Category Review -Film Production

Software can be used to develop, enhance and/or present an entry but may not provide the primary design and/or concept. Entrants must

provide a brief description of the tools and method used in the creation process.

Copyright. Plagiarized entries will be disqualified. Use of copyrighted material, including any copyrighted cartoon characters, material

downloaded from the internet, copyrighted recorded music or copyrighted photographs or stock images, is not acceptable, except for the

following:

- If background music is used in film production entries, it must be cited on the entry form (title, composer and performer).
- Entries may include public places, well-known products, trademarks or certain other copyrighted material as long as that copyrighted material is incidental to the subject matter of the piece and/or is a smaller element of a whole. The resulting work cannot try to establish an association between the student and the trademark/business/material, or influence the purchase/non-purchase of the trademarked good.
- Entries should primarily be the student's original production, including the design process, original footage and/or student-created content. Any copyrighted media should be used sparingly to create a completely new and different work of art and only used to emphasize the purpose/goal of the student's production and original content.

Category Review-Literature

■ 2,000 words or less - single pdf file.

■ Handwritten or typed. If the student artist is unable, entries may be dictated to another person and printed or typed in exact words as provided by the student.

- Illustrations by student are allowed, but will not be judged.
- No clip art, photos, comic books, or comic strips.
- Original piece created for Reflections.
- Plagiarism don't do it.

Always cite.

Category Review -Photography

- New pieces of artwork inspired by theme.
- Finished piece, including matting/mounting may not exceed 11x14 inches.
- Entry may not focus on copyrighted material.
- No added words or graphics, including borders. All parts of the entry must be photograph(s) taken by student.
- Combining photos is allowed. Final product must be a single seamless print.
- No frames.
- .jpg format.
- Entrant must be photographer.

Category Review -2D Visual Arts

- New pieces of art inspired by theme.
- Max size 24x30 inches, including matting.
- No frames or shadow boxes.
- .jpg format.
- Entries may not focus on copyrighted material.

Category Review - 3D Visual Arts



Paisley Bybee - "Chords Can Speak" 3D Visual Arts Intermediate Division Region 16

- Only new work inspired by theme.
- No size limit.
- Graphic novels, comic books, frames, and shadow boxes not allowed ... exceptions?
- Entry must be one piece of art with no loose pieces.
 All pieces must be attached.

■ Entry may not require manipulation to be viewed fully - no flaps, doors that moves, boxes that open. They must be in the same position for all photos.

■ Upload 3 photos from various angles. A coin or ruler to show scale is helpful, but not required.

Student should not appear in picture. Not against rules though.

Copyright

What is a Copyright Violation?

The use of copyrighted material, including any copyrighted characters or likeness thereof, is not acceptable in any submission, with the following exceptions:

■ Film productions, photography and visual art may include public places, well-known products, trademarks or other copyrighted material, as long as that copyrighted material is incidental to the subject matter of the piece and is a smaller element of the whole.

■ Visual arts, photography and film production entries may include portions of existing copyrighted works, such as portions of photos, magazine clippings, internet images and type cut out of a newspaper, as long as those pieces of copyrighted works are used to create a completely new and different work of art. A collage should be judged for its whole—not its parts—and its creativity as an original work of art.

Copyright

Questions to help determine if an entry has violated copyright laws:

If the questioned portion of the artwork were removed, would it alter the message of the art?

- YES likely a violation
- Can it stand alone without that part? YES - likely NOT a violation

Is the questioned part INCIDENTAL to the artwork? YES - likely not a violation

If you aren't sure, ASK! Contact your council or region Reflections Specialist if you aren't sure.

Plagiarism

What is Plagiarism?

Plagiarism is the practice of taking someone else's work or ideas and passing them off as one's own.

Do not quote another person without giving credit. This applies to every category.

If you aren't sure, ASK! Contact your council or region Reflections Specialist if you aren't sure.

Which Category?

■ It is not appropriate to move an entry into another category without the permission of the student

■ It is not appropriate to switch an entry to the Accessible Arts Division without the permission of the student and/or parent.

- If an entry needs to move to a different category to qualify for judging, speak to the student and/or parent.
- 2D Visual Art Category Entries typically can be hung on the wall.
 Exception quilt.
- 3D Visual Art Category Entries an entry that generally would not be hung on the wall for display.
