Nominating Committee

Article VI: Sections 5 & 6

- Elected by December 31st
- Uneven Number of people with alternates (Refer to local bylaws for specific numbers)
 *One is from Executive Committee
 - *Must be members of PTA for 7 days
- No meeting is held with less than 3 members

The President orients the committee but does not serve on the committee.

President-Elect and Principal are consultants to the committee.

Reporting

Nominating Committee reports to Executive Committee 5 days before reporting at a general membership meeting and 14 days before the general election meeting

- Recommendations can be made to the nominating committee by any member PRIOR to the first meeting of the committee
- Nominees MUST be a PTA member for at least 7 days prior to the meeting where nominees are reported (if they are members of a different PTA, they need to pay dues to this PTA)
- Nominees must give consent to serve ©
- Nominations can be made from the floor at the general reporting meeting or interested persons can file with the secretary at least 5 days prior to the election meeting

Alternates: An alternate may attend committee meetings only as a replacement. If a member of the committee fails to attend 2 meetings, they are replaced by an alternate.

If a member of the committee is selected for election to an office, that member is replaced by an alternate.

Why?

It is important for all areas of a school to be represented.

It is important to nominate members who see the value of PTA and who will support the mission of the organization.

Can avoid hard feelings
