**Legislative Priority:** 

Support an adequately funded public school system by funding an 8% WPU increase over and above growth and inflation; implement policies to increase proficiency levels by improving attendance, reducing class sizes, and supporting teachers; increase academic excellence for all Utah Students; and prioritize local control to LEAs and individual schools.

#### Bills to Watch:

HB 29: Sensitive Material Review Amendments

HB 105: Tax Credit for Educator Expenses

HB 161: School Board Amendments
