



Studies from the Utah Education Policy Center at the University of Utah and elsewhere indicate that chronic absenteeism is a proven predictor of lower academic performance and higher dropout rates. Other studies showing best practices indicate that parents and community who work together to promote good attendance and to address the challenges that keep children from getting to and staying in school and provide early identification programs have a positive effect on school attendance.

In 2017 voters passed Amendment B which amended the State School Fund provisions of the Utah Constitution which modified the description of what can be distributed from the State School Fund from "interest and dividends" to "earnings", limited annual distributions from the State School Fund to 4% of the fund, and and modified the standard governing how the state is required to invest money in the Fund. This Bill aligns statute with the changes that were made by the passage of Amendment B. This changed will help to increase and stabilize the distribution from the permanent State School Fund through the School LAND Trust program. Trust Land Funds are distributed to all public schools and spent through the plans designed by local School Community Councils which consist of parents, teachers, and administrators.




