<i>Identify and Summarize</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The source of the article is credible because... The author's intent is to...[inform? persuade?] In one sentence, this article is about... The main ideas in this article are...
<i>Draw Connections</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> In the text it said that...this is similar to... An example from my life related to this is... This is important because... This might cause controversy because...
<i>Paraphrase a Partner's Ideas</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> What I understood was... It sounds like you think that...is that a fair way of explaining your thoughts? Let me see if I understand you... In a nutshell you are saying...
<i>Build On and/or Challenge a Partner's Idea</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I would add that.... Building on your idea that...I think... I see it a different way... That reminds me of... Another way to look at this could be...
<i>Synthesize Conversation Points</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We can agree that... We disagree that... The main idea seems to be... As a result of this discussion, we think that... It boils down to... Even though some might think that... we conclude that...
